A new or expectant mother is a woman who is pregnant, has given birth within the last six months or is breastfeeding. 'Given birth' is described in the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999 (the Management Regulations) as having 'delivered a living child or, after 24 weeks ...maternity service as soon as possible if the mother requires support with moving and handling. Mothers are given a choice, whenever possible, of their requirements for the birth of their baby. Consideration must be given if that choice will be limited because the lack of foresight of manual handling needs, such as no hoist'
